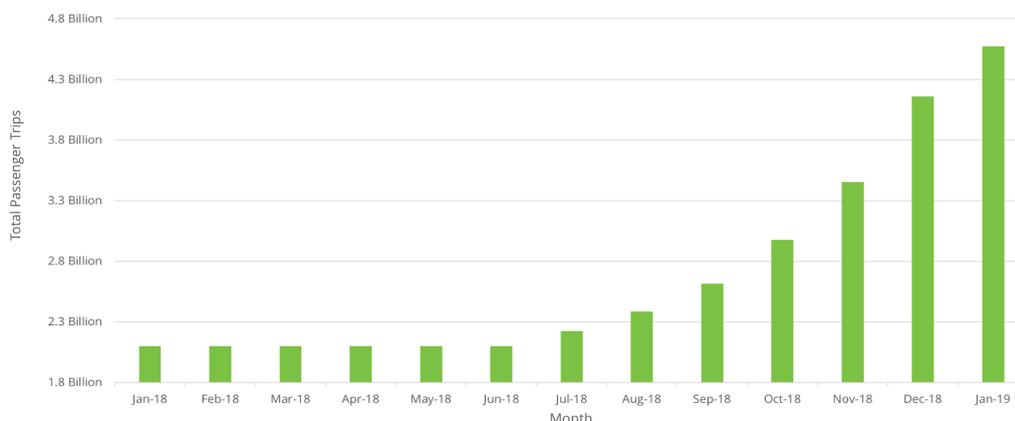
Jayride now live in 44 countries – 13 new countries online in Asia Pacific, Europe and the Caribbean
